Welcome

The inaugural East Asian Fellows Program in Aging, Hearing, and Public Health will be held **July 15 - July 19, 2019** at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, Maryland.

Purpose

The purpose of this one-week program is to bring together a community of dedicated clinicians and researchers who are interested in learning how to study and address the public health impact of hearing loss on older adults in East Asian countries. This program will be led by Johns Hopkins Cochlear Center faculty and other researchers and clinicians from the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health and School of Medicine. Lectures and small group sessions will provide an overview of public health concepts, methods, and strategies to clinicians and researchers in East Asia who are pursuing public health research and projects focused on addressing hearing loss in older adults.

About the Cochlear Center

The Cochlear Center for Hearing & Public Health is based at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and is the only center of its kind in the world focused exclusively on issues related to hearing loss and public health in older adults. At the Cochlear Center, we believe that ensuring older adults can effectively hear and engage with the people and world around them is key to optimizing the health and well-being of an aging population. Our mission is to train a generation of clinicians and researchers to study the public health impact of hearing loss and to implement public health strategies & solutions.

Costs

Participation in this program is free. The Cochlear Center for Hearing & Public Health will cover accommodations, meals, and social events. Participants will be responsible for arranging their own transportation to Baltimore.
